

## MARCY RAE-SWEET MAMA COTTON

Marcy Rae's many years of piano training and performing in bands from California to Israel brought her to Texas. Marcy's blues repertoire includes standards such as "Stormy Monday" and "Down Home Blues," and classics from the jazz/blues era of Bessie Smith and Sippie Wallace. She also rocks out on Chuck Berry-style tunes and some funky dance tunes like "Shaky Ground." Her diverse background has expanded her repertoire to include classic standards, folk, rock, and country music as well as blues. And mixed in is a healthy dose of original music. Marcy's originals also cover a variety of styles, including "Cloudy Texas Skies," a Stevie Ray Vaughn-type song; "Voodoo Daddy," a rockin' celebration of romance; and "Down to Memphis," a rockabilly-style ode to a blues mecca. Her latest album, SUH-WEEET, includes ten original blues tunes that range from a Jerry Lee Lewis homage, "I Wanna," to the song she wrote in honor of Kathleen "The Blues Broad" Kern's funeral, "The Bearer of the Blues." Marcy sang with the University of Michigan Choral Union, a 300-voice choir that performed with the Philadelphia Orchestra. She has played on bills with Ray Campi and the Rebels, Jackson Browne, The Blasters, Blood Sweat and Tears, and Rose Maddox, and was keyboard player for The Drifters on a Southern tour. **Marcy Rae**, aka **Sweet Mama Cotton**, presents a confident statement of "new Texas blues with respect for tradition." ## WHAT WE DO

The CLC Children's and Youth Services Department is devoted to celebrating the spiritual development of each child we teach. All age groups are involved in various activities, workshops, and special projects incorporating the teachings of Science of Mind. We strive to create an atmosphere of love and kindness in our words and actions toward each other and to recognize and honor the diversity of every person.

● **Toddlers** (18 mos. to age 3) are lovingly cared for by our toddler teachers. In their very artistically designed Discovery Room, the children are encouraged to interact and experience their world as only a toddler can. They are offered games, toys, books and other age-appropriate activities in a safe, secure and loving environment.

● **4-6 age group.** Beginning around the age of 4, our toddlers are moved to the Ingenuity Room. This group begins to learn the basics of Treatment and the value of giving a smile and a kind word. Our creative teachers provide age-appropriate instruction and activities.

● **7-11 age group** are in the Quimby Room, regularly practicing the steps of Treatment presented in a manner appropriate to their age group. The teachers provide learning tools, creative projects, workshops and other teaching methods to engage each child's learning of the principles of Science of Mind.

● **12-15 age group** meets on the second floor of the Learning Center in the Hopkins classroom. They are engaged in special projects, workshops, have guest speakers and are involved in several volunteer service endeavors at CLC. The teachers working with this group encourage their talents, keep them engaged in learning Science of Mind principles and we throw in a bit of fun along the way!




## Weddings


