We in the Western world are inheritors of a culture that has been molded more by religious attitudes than by anything else, even the pursuit of material gain. *Faith of Our Fathers* is a

lecture course that was created during the summer of 2001 by minister **Jesse Jennings** and was originally scheduled to begin the week of September 11 of that year. Instead, history happened, involving a collision of several of the systems of thought and faith that the course itself was expressly designed to consider. The course title alludes to patriarchy, to the *Pater Noster*, and to our ancestors. Here you will extend your acquaintance with the Bible, and other sacred writings, into a guided tour of religious doctrines,



continued from page 1 practices, and their consequences, (for believer, infidel, bystander, and us) from the time of Christianity's legalization by Constantine in 313CE through the Protestant Reforma-

tion. ca. 1517-1600CE. In four evenings we will immerse ourselves in the theological, literary, musical, social, political, economic and military history of Western religion — a history most of us didn't hear in school, but that paved the way for all the spiritualities that were to follow, including our own. 



WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO BECOME A PRACTITIONER?

It starts with a willingness to be of service to others through prayer. Then there are basic and intermediate Science of Mind classes— beginning with *Heartfelt Living: The Foundational Course*; including *Treatment and Meditation: Spiritual Practices for Daily Living*; plus 45 hours of other intermediate classes such as *Self Mastery* and *Roots of Science of Mind*. These are then followed by two intensive 30-week (90-hour) professional trainings, each comprising a full academic year. During this time, students complete much inner work, in-class and at-home study, including field work, and build connections with established practitioners. The process concludes with a written exam and an oral panel. Practitioners are licensed for two years; they must renew by amassing "continuing licensing units" indicating ongoing education, participation and volunteer service to the community of Creative Life.
